0-18yrs

Moderate to severe mental ill health including:

- Complex or severe anxiety e.g. OCD, GAD, PTSD, panic disorder, social phobia.
- Mood disorders e.g. depression, bipolar affective disorder.
- Psychosis/early onset schizophrenia.
- in mental ill health.
- Attention deficit hyperactivity disorder\* Persistent school refuasal with a basis
- Motor &/or vocal tic disorder e.g. Tourette's syndrome.

• Eating disorders e.g. anorexia nervosa. • Deliberate self-harm and/or suicidal ideation with a basis in mental ill health.

Where there is significant comorbid mental health condition in the following presentations: Attachment disorder; conduct disorder; ASD; intellectual disability; physical conditions e.g. chronic fatigue, epilepsy, DCD etc..

For children & young people aged 0 - 18 years

CAMHS is a specialised multi-disciplinary tertiary Mental Health service for children & adolescents with the most severe & disabling mental health disorders (2%-5%). Assessment & intervention is offered up to 18 years on a case by case basis. Referrals are accepted from medical professionals including GPs, Psychiatrists, Physicians & Paediatricians.

\*Where there is a query of ADHD other measures to assess for and provide input for other causes of the behaviour should be done first. Concerns re intellectual or learning problems should be identified and responded to within the school's continuum of support process. Other developmental disorders should have OT and / or paediatric and/ or CDT assessment. Parenting issues should be addressed via Parenting Monaghan or primary care.

**NATIONAL EDUCATIONAL PSYCHOLOGICAL SERVICE (NEPS)** 

Types of referrals to the service:

Involvement in casework arises through a planning process with a school principal and SEN personnel, and follows from work undertaken within School's Continuum of Support process.

NEPS involvement may relate to wellbeing, academic, social and emotional development, and seeks to provide a more in-depth understanding of the student's strengths and needs, to inform intervention.

For children 4-18 years

NEPS psychologists work with primary and post-primary schools, across mainstream and special settings, to provide a consultation-based service designed to support the wellbeing, and the academic, social and emotional development of all students, with particular regard for those with special educational needs and those at risk of educational disadvantage. In addition to casework, NEPS psychologists engage in 'Support and Development' work, which involves helping to build school capacity to intervene early and work preventatively. Following a process of planning and prioritisation a school principal must obtain parental consent when making a request for NEPS involvement.

Cost Free. Parental consent required.

COUNSELLING **IN PRIMARY CARE SERVICE** (CIPC)

18yrs +



CIPC is the provision of short term counselling in primary care settings.

Available to medical card holders aged 18 years and over by professionally qualified and accredited Counsellor/ Therapists who work under the supervision of the HSE National Counselling Service.

- Mild to moderate psychological problems
- Depression Anxiety states including mild
- specific phobias and panic attacks Non-complex loss & bereavement
- Coping with injury or illness
- Adjustment problems
- Life cycle issues
- Stress and specific trauma
- Relationship difficulties

Young People 18yrs and over

Referrals can be made by GPs or other members of the Primary Care Team with the GP's awareness.

The National Counselling Service HSE is a free service for any adult who has experienced the trauma of abuse or neglect in childhood.

The NCS provides professional counselling and psychotherapy services to help people to cope better with their life and relationships.

18 years +

The NCS is the dedicated counselling service for adults with a history of childhood abuse. The service is free and does not require a Medical Card. People can self referral (via the Freephone number) or be referred by their local GP.

For Young People 18 years and over

Referrals to the Adult Mental health team are made by a GP. Once a referral is received the Mental Health team will contact you to arrange an appointment for assessment and to plan any identified treatment. The team is available from 9am - 5pm, outside of these hours contact Doc On Call or go to the Emergency department at Cavan General Hospital. Mental Health services are free, if you are not a medical card holder you will be charged for attending Doc on Call /or the Emergency Department.

- Complex Bereavement and loss
