VIRTUAL YOUTH CLUB

Springboard Tusla have been working in collaboration with the Good Shepherd Services since June 2016 offering a therapeutic and educational 'Youth Club' for families and children experiencing homelessness in Cork. This initiative supports children weekly offering an array of services including weekly youth club, boxing club, homework club as well as individual therapeutic work for targeted children and families.



Due to the Covid 19 crisis, youth club and physical interaction was not possible. There was still a need for support for the children. Services had to adapt very quickly and in the vision of Winnicott, continue to 'hold it' with these families and children. It was agreed by both the Good Shepherd Service and Springboard Tusla Management that each family be provided with a tablet. Each tablet was specifically customized with specialised apps to the childrens' ages and interests. Information was provided to parents on Internet Safety and content installed on the devices.

Padlet was also installed on each tablet which in turn was linked to our **closed** Good Shepherd Service Padlet page. Padlet is an interactive online notice-board where a worker can upload links, documents, discussions or anything of interest that may help maintain a relationship with a child or family. As a result, the children and young people are now linked in with supports around fun fitness, arts, education and sport. Some of the staff from youth club are also putting up pre-recorded pieces of work which in essence maintains the relationship and has led to the creation of 'Virtual Youth Club'. Administrators of Padlet are all members of the GSS/Tusla Springboard collaboration 'POD' of workers. Some are working in the family hub (Redclyffe House), Edel House or as part of the B&B/Hotel outreach team where they respond to families' changing needs as they arise.

This initiative has provided the team with daily interaction and linkages with the children, uploading and monitoring material regularly. It has created a space where child care staff and team members can connect with families and children during this difficult period. The children and parents can comment and rate the material, giving guidance on areas of interest. A parent's column is also available with relevant information and support.

The initiative offers a continuation of interaction and support for these children and families, maintaining the consistency of 'Youth club', although in an alternative format.
