DONEGAL CYPSC

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The Donegal Children & Young People's Committee (CYPSC) aims to improve outcomes for children and young people aged 0-24 years in County Donegal.

The purpose of CYPSCs are to bring statutory, community and voluntary agencies providing services to children and young people together to cooperate and plan and work in a coordinated way. CYPSC's are funded through the Department of Children and Youth Affairs and Chaired by Tusla. The local authority holds the position of Deputy Chair. They work to support children, young people and their families to achieve the five national outcomes set out in Better Outcomes, Brighter Futures: the National Policy Framework for Children and Young People 2014-2020.

The national outcomes are that Children & Young People are:

- *Active and healthy with physical and mental well-being
- *Achieving full potential in all areas of learning & development
- *Safe and protected from harm
- *Have economic security and opportunity and
- *Are connected, respected and contributing to their world.

Over forty organisations across Donegal work in partnership to achieve these outcomes.

Parent Hub Donegal - An initiative of Donegal CYPSC

Over the past ten months County Donegal has been buzzing with training opportunities for those working to support positive parenting. Parent Hub Donegal secured funding from The Wheel to roll out training for facilitators in the full suite of Parents Plus programmes plus the LifeStart Spirals programme. We also went further and organised additional training to upskill facilitators and those working with parents in situations of additional need or where alcohol is impacting on family life and parenting. The Alcohol Forum provided us with an excellent workshop on 'Busting myths about alcohol' and 'Alcohol and the Teenage Brain'. The shortfall in funding was made up by Tusla, Donegal ETB, Donegal Local Development Company and with contributions in kind by LifeStart, Springboard/Finn Valley FRC, HSE, the Alcohol Forum and ParentStop. This type of integrated, collaborative working is key to how CYPSC functions. Facilitators have been trained in the Early Years, Children's, Adolescent and Parenting When Separated programmes as well as in the CBT based Working Things Out programme for use with teenagers. Parent Hub ran several of these programmes around the County, including Dungloe, Falcarragh, Letterkenny, Raphoe, Stranorlar and Carndonagh. The expanded network of facilitators means that the programme will be available to more places and more parents around Donegal.

The training calendar finished on a high on 29th May with a group of over fifty facilitators, Family Support Workers, Tusla and HSE staff exploring how we can support parenting in situations of complex and additional need.

Excellent input was provided by Joanne Dowds EIT, Karen McMenamin Community Facilitator for Disability, Leslaw Migut and Sorcha Bolger Community Psychology and Nuala Caslin and Maeve Mangaoang CAMHS. We had the opportunity to listen and share experience, to network and learn from others, to reaffirm our belief that the best way to support children and young people is to support their parents, that's what ParentHub Donegal is about.

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Creating Lifelong Readers (CLR) workshops for Early Educators

In May 2019, Donegal County Childcare Committee facilitated 2 CLR workshops in conjunction with the Donegal County Library to Early Educators in Letterkenny. The programme explores the development of literacy in the early years with a key element focussing on the importance of parents reading regularly with their children. As part of the Education and Learning subgroup of CYPSC, DCCC in conjunction with Donegal County Library and Lifestart provide information and resources to Preschool settings to implement a weekly lending library for parents and children from the preschool setting. Roll outs of the CLR programme are scheduled to take place in Buncrana and Bundoran in Autumn / Winter 2019. Creating Lifelong Readers is an initiative of the Education & Learning Subcommittee of Donegal CYPSC.

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Donegal CYPSC Funding UPDATE

Better Outcomes ,Brighter Futures Funding 2019 is €28,000 to be administered via Tusla Cost Centre. As agreed by CYPSC €5,000 is allocated to CYPSC Events and associated printing, venue and refreshment costs. This will include the Disability Progressive Pathways Fair planned for November 2019. The balance is available to CYPSC Subcommittees to support the implementation of the Children & Young People's Plan during 2019. To date proposals for funding support include Donegal Traveller's Project for a Traveller & Roma Homework Club, Tusla Alternative Care 16+ for a Youth Conference,

town, Foroige for a residential event for participants in the Be Healthy Be Happy Programme, Raphoe Family Resource Centre to run Mindfulness workshops for Adolescents in the Raphoe area and a Strategic review of Parenting Supports in County Donegal will also receive funding support.

Healthy Ireland Round 3: HIF Round 3 will run from July 2019 to June 2021. Donegal CYPSC has been allocated €96,000 to implement a programme of work under HIF during the 2 year period, €48,000 per year. This is a joint application with Donegal LCDC. Proposals for funding must be aligned with the Children & Young People's Plan 2018-2021 and the Local Economic & Community Plan. Expressions of Interest have been received from 8 CYPSC member organisations and are currently being processed, 5 of which will be included in the joint application.
