This Community Support Helpline is to assist at risk members of the public in accessing nonemergency and non-medical supports and advice during the current public health emergency. The confidential phone line service has been established by the new **COVID-19 Donegal Community Response Forum**. The helpline is focused primarily on ensuring that vulnerable members of the community or those living alone can access deliveries of groceries, medicine and fuels. The role of the Forum is to ensure that there is a co-ordinated community response and to enable all voluntary statutory agencies to collaborate in support of our communities and particularly of our most vulnerable members. The new phoneline is just one aspect of the Forum's work. Its core aim is contributing to the community-wide effort to limit the spread of COVID-19. Donegal County Council, through this group, will ensure that the wide variety of groups working across the county to assist those in need, will do so in an organised, collaborative and targeted way. The Community Response Forum is there to ensure the very best use of the many resources assisting vulnerable persons with their daily needs at this unprecedented time, whether that is collecting medication, food shopping, social support and contact.

Donegal County Childcare Committee - supports the early years

The following are the main points from the FAQ document on the COIVID-19 Measures which each childcare service needs to be fully aware of:

The Revenue Wage Subsidy Scheme commenced on the 26 March 2020 and can be availed of by any ELC and SAC providers where their turnover has likely been reduced by 25% or more for Q2 2020. The WSS supersedes the Employer COVID Refund scheme, which has now ceased.

Services do not have to sign-up to either the Revenue operated COVID-19 Temporary Subsidy Scheme or the DCYA Wage Subsidy Childcare Scheme, however, from the date the WSCS goes live, no further payments will be made to centre based providers for the DCYA ELC and SAC funding programmes.

Once the Wage Subsidy Childcare Scheme is up and running, providers can sign a new agreement or contract and DCYA will provide the top ups and overhead contributions. Payments once processed will be made retrospective to the date of signing and subject to confirmation that provider is participating in the temporary Covid-19 Wage Subsidy Scheme. If a provider chooses not to sign the agreement or enter into the WSCS there will be no alternative stream of funding.

We would strongly urge you to read all the documentation, the FAQs from both revenue and from the DCYA, thoroughly so that you are in a position to make a decision regarding entering the WSCS or not in the coming days.
