Donegal Parent Support Line is a confidential freephone service for parents or anyone in a parenting role. If you would like to talk through any worries or difficulties you are facing as a parent consider contacting the Support Line. Your call will be taken initially by a staff member who will get a clearer picture of what your worries are and some details to arrange for you to receive a call-back from one of our panel of experienced family support, youth support or healthcare workers. This call will

give you a chance to talk through whatever is bothering you and will give you tips and guidance on how to move forward. They will also be able to tell you about other supports and services in the community that might be of help to you and

your family.

If you cannot phone, please send a private message to the Parent Hub Donegal Facebook page with your name, phone number and a brief description of the issue you are looking for information/support with. You will receive a call back the next day except for calls/messages received Friday - Sunday which will be replied to on Monday.



Sensory Gifts Bags

Donegal CYPSC became aware of the heightened levels of stress and anxiety experienced by young people with a disability or additional needs, as a direct result of the COVID19 restrictions. Working with the Bluestack Special Needs Foundation a funding proposal was made to CYPSC for the re-direction of funding to implement the **Sensory Support Gift Bags Initiative.** The initiative supported 4 local charities: Bluestack Special Needs Foundation, Sproai Agus Sport, Donegal Down Syndrome & ICARE. All of whom, work with young people with physical, sensory and intellectual disabilities across Donegal.

Sproai agus Sport delivered their Sensory Gifts Bags this week pictures below, A great initiative of collaboration in Donegal which Donegal CYPSC funded.

developed by the parents themselves, based on common concerns in relation to children's' screen time. These short videos were developed in Co. Kildare, with a group of parents from St. Farnan's Post Primary School, Prosperous. The project partners are: County Kildare LEADER Partnership, Foróige Drug Prevention & Education Initiative, Tusla and Kildare CYPSC.
