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Consultation with young children



Through the Donegal County Childcare Committee early years providers were asked to invite parents in their services to submit words or a drawing from their child in answer to the questions ...

A - I would magic the shops open for all the children, because we are not allowed to go to the shops because of the sick (covid 19)

































Profile of Parents Gender and Age











Stakeholder Survey


Profile of Stakeholders

Organisations involved in Donegal CYPSC Stakeholder Survey









