What is a Children and Young People's Service Committee?

Children and Young People's Services Committees (CYPSC) are a structure for bringing together a diverse group of agencies and organisations in a local area to engage in joint planning and co-ordination of services for children and young people. The overall purpose of CYPSC is to secure better outcomes for children and young people.

Children and Young People's Service Committees are the key structure identified by Government to plan and co-ordinate services for children and young people in every county in Ireland. Children and Young People's services Committees promote support and deliver national and local interagency working across services that work with and for children and young people in Ireland.

Children and young people's services Committees secure better outcomes for children and young people by:

- Coordinating the implementation of national and regional policies and strategies that relate to children, young people and families.
- Planning and coordinating services for children and young people in the area covered by the CYPSC
- Eliminating fragmentation and duplication of services by ensuring more effective collaboration between children, young people and family services within the area
- Influencing the allocation of resources
- Strengthening the decision-making capacity at local level

The Department of Children and Youth Affairs (DCYA) provides funding and strategic and policy direction for CYPSC. Four original sites were chosen to pilot this interagency work in 2007 (Dublin City, South Dublin, Donegal and Limerick City). Since then 22 CYPSCs have been established across Ireland on a phased basis, each at a different stage of development and operation. A national roll out of CYPSC to remaining counties is ongoing.

AS of January 2015 a CYPSC has been established in the following locations: Carlow, Kilkenny, Cavan, Monaghan, Cork, Donegal, Dublin City North, Dublin City South, Fingal, Galway, Kerry, Kildare, Limerick, Longford Westmeath, Louth, Mayo, Meath, Roscommon, Sligo Leitrim, South Dublin, South Tipperary, Waterford, Wexford and Wicklow. CYPSC have led and supported inspiring and positive programmes and activities in the fields of Literacy Development, Parenting Support, Early Childhood Development, Transitions to school, Youth mental health and much more.

CYPSC Website The new national CYPSC website <u>www.cypsc.ie</u> is now live. The website provides a focal point for national and local information pertaining to CYPSC. Information on CYPSC news and events are listed and key CYPSC documents are available for download.

Purpose & Mandate of Donegal CYPSC:

The central purpose of the Donegal Children & Young Peoples Services Committee (CPYSC) will be to provide strategic direction and leadership to ensure effective interagency co-ordination and collaboration to achieve the best outcomes for all children and young people in County Donegal. Donegal CYPSC will act as the structure whereby services can work together in a systematic manner to achieve shared goals and which bridge national policy with local provision. The mandate for CYPSCs has developed from Government policy over time and is renewed in the context of Better Outcomes Better Futures: The National Policy Framework for Children and Young People 2014 – 2020.

Remit:

Donegal CYPSC is the key vehicle for interagency working for children and young people in the age range 0-24 year (inclusive), reflecting the different developmental phases and associated needs and challenges of each stage of childhood, youth and extending into early adulthood. The work of Donegal CYPSC adheres to the concept of progressive universalism and spans policy areas and service provision, from the universal to targeted services and supports for children and young people.

A Children and Young People's Plan for County Donegal

Donegal CYPSC is required to develop and deliver on a 3 year Children & Young People's Plan (CYPP) for the county. This plan

- Details how children and young people in the county are doing (a socio demographic profile)
- Describes what services, supports and groups are currently available in the county for children and young people (an audit of services)
- Identifies gaps and provides direction as to what the county can do to better to improve services and improve outcomes for children and young people (a needs analysis)
- Sets out what the CYPSC will do over a three-year period to improve outcomes under five national outcomes for children and young people (an action plan)
- Outlines how the CYPSC will monitor and evaluate its work so that it knows what has been achieved by the committee i.e. what is working and what the impact of that work has been for children and young people.

Donegal CYPSC Induction Pack

With a comprehensive picture of the needs of children, young people and families in the county, Donegal CYPSC will then identify appropriate evidence informed and/or evidence based responses. The CYPP will be informed by the CYPSC member agencies, have a specific regard for the voice of children and young people and be linked to all members agencies service plans including all other local and regional plans such as the Donegal Local Economic and Community Plan.

CYPSC projects and initiatives have contributed to improving outcomes for children and young people under a range of themes including Literacy, parenting Support, Consultation with Children and young people and identification and assessment of the needs of children and young people, to name a few.

National Co-ordinator for Children and Young People's Services Committees

The National Co-ordinator for Children and Young People's Services Committees provides leadership for CYPSE at national level and supports local CYPSC through their CYPSC Chairperson and CYPSC Co-ordinator.

CYPSC Membership

The average size of a CYPSC is 16 people and consists of senior managers, representing a range of agencies, services and sectors including:

- Tusla Child & Family Agency
- Local Authority
- Health Service Executive (HSE)
- An Garda Síochána
- Education & Training Board
- ❖ National Association of Principals and Deputy Principals
- Irish Primary Principals Network
- ❖ National Educational Psychological Service (NEPS)
- City / County Childcare Committee
- Social Inclusion Partners e.g. Local Development Companies
- Community & Voluntary organisations
- Probation Services Department of Social Protection
- ❖ 3rd level institution
- ❖ Young person 18 -24 years

Every effort is made to ensure an appropriate skill mix and range of expertise/experience on Donegal CYPSC. Membership will be sufficiently flexible to ensure that as the work of the Donegal CYPSC develops the required range of representatives across all associated agencies and sectors are invited to attend. It is important that membership is drawn from the most senior rank possible from each agency and stakeholder group.

Appendix 2- Donegal CYPSC Membership List

CYPSCs have on average 5 to 7 Sub Committees which reflect the five National Outcomes for Children and Young People and the priority areas in their Children and Young People's Plans. Each Sub Committee could comprise 5 to 10 people, many of whom do not sit on the CYPSC. Each CYPSC Sub

Committee may also have one or more working groups for specific areas of work. So any one CYPSC could have 100 or more individuals co-operating and collaborating to improve services for Children, young people and families in their area. *Appendix 3-Donegal CYPSC Structures & linkages 2016*Five National Outcomes for Children and Young People

The Government launched 'Better Outcomes, Brighter Futures': The National Framework for Children and Young People 2014-2020' on 16th April 2014. It is the first overarching national policy framework for children and young people aged 0 – 24 years, It recognises that almost all policy has a direct or indirect effect on children and young people's lives, underscores the necessity of interagency working and tasks Children and Young People's Services Committee (CYPSCs) with a key role in this regard. The working of Children & young People's Services Committees is informed by the 5 national outcomes for children and young as set out in 'Better Outcomes, Brighter Futures'. They are

- 1. Active and Health with physical and mental wellbeing
- 2. Achieving full potential in all areas of learning and development
- 3. Safe and protected from harm
- 4. Have economic security and opportunity
- 5. Connected, respected and contributing to their world.

The Children and Young People's Policy Consortium

The Children & Young People's Policy Consortium was established as part of the implementation structures outlined in *'Better Outcomes, Brighter Futures: the National Policy Framework for Children and Young People 2014 – 2020.'* The consortium is chaired by the Secretary General of the Department of Children and Youth affairs and comprises of senior officials from Government departments and agencies and representatives from advisory and local operational fora. The Consortium has oversight of and drives cross-Government implementation for 'Better Outcomes, Brighter Futures' and its supporting strategies, and reports annually to Government on progress achieved.

Children and Young People's Services Committee National Steering Group

The Children and Young Peoples Services Committees National Steering Group (CYPSC SG) was established in 2012 to support the effective operation and practical implementation of Children and Young People's Services Committees at local level. It has an independent Chairperson, who is a member of the Children and Young people's Policy Consortium; representing and reporting on behalf of CYPSCs.

Interagency working

The need for Interagency working is well recognised. International literature tells us that where evidence of the impact of interagency working does exist, it is mostly positive; although it takes time to become embedded in practice. When implemented well, interagency working achieves changes in the way we and our organisations work. Effective interagency working acts to create the 'permitting circumstances' for better functioning of front-line services and front-line staff. It is a vitally important part of improving outcomes for children, young people and their families, by means of its potential to improve all the front-line services to support them.

The 3 Key interagency messages of CYPSC are:

- When we work together we can make a positive difference in the lives of our children and young people
- Working together is a sustained way is challenging, takes time and requires continuous learning; but it is worth it.
- · We are doing this through Children and Young People's Services Committees
