Donegal ETB offers a range of Further Education and Training (FET) programmes for those wishing to gain recognised qualifications and begin their journey in lifelong learning. Their programmes range from Levels 1-6 on the National Framework of Qualifications and there are options available throughout the year on both a full-time and part-time basis, during the day and in the evenings. The courses offered provide pathways from Community Education and Foundation level to further and higher education as well as routes to employment. Donegal ETB students can avail of a range of supports including reasonable accommodation where appropriate. The purpose is to support students with a disability to compete equally, on a level playing field with other students.

To be eligible for the scheme you must provide evidence that your disability has affected your educational performance significantly.

To apply for a college place under DARE:

- To apply for a college place under the DARE Scheme you should apply through the Central Applications Office (CAO)
- Complete the part of the form to say that you have a disability or a specific learning difficulty.
- You will then be directed to the separate online Supplementary Information Form



Services Provided: Inishowen Children's Autism Related Education (iCARE) exists to support autistic individuals and their families in the Inishowen area. Established in September 2000 by a small group of parents, we work to break down barriers and promote inclusion. We are committed to advocating for our members and ensuring equity of opportunity for all. *There are 3 elements of services provided :*

iCARE: Our centre operates 6 days per week , Monday - Saturday. We provide after school sessions, a Saturday Club and school holiday programmes. This is a self referral process.

SONAS Youth Club: We have a youth club for young people aged 11+ called Sonas. This gives our young people a chance to meet others, form friendships and enjoy social activities with their peers.

iADULT Day Service: Established in 2020 this service is for persons aged 18 + presenting with mild / moderate Autism Spectrum Condition and/or intellectual disabilities. Service users learn and practice skills in group sessions and work towards transferring these skills to work independently in a placement within our community. Service users are referred by the HSE Guidance officer.
