Dublin Safer Families Service, Santry, Dublin 9. 018627700

- DSFS is a Gender, Sexual and Domestic Abuse Service working with parents and children to prevent and stop domestic abuse.
- The primary focus is to increase safety in the family for the children.
- A unique aspect of the Dublin Safer Families Service is to provide a whole family approach. DSFS works with victims, children and perpetrators using a Systemic Model.
- Referrals are solely received from Social Work services and the Probation service.





Initial Assessment Services:

- Initial Assessments, using the Signs of Safety model, are carried out on cases referred by TUSLA Social Work Department that have been identified as low or medium risk.
- On completion of the Assessment, recommendations are made for the case to be closed with no further action, referred for further action by TUSLA, or referred to other support services including DoCCFS Family Centre Response teams where they can avail of therapeutic support.

In all our centres children and families present with a range of issues:

- Abuse , Neglect and Welfare.
- Anger /behaviour management
- Impact of Parental addiction issues
 - Mild Anxiety and Social Phobia
 - Bereavement
 - Children in Care
 - Child to parent Violence (NVR)
- Impact of parental mental health
- Impact of domestic violence (Victim led specific)
 - Separation +Loss
 - Trauma
 - Parenting

We undertake to provide a quality service:

- All therapeutic approaches to working with children are under-pinned by theory, knowledge, experience and the use of evidence-based models.
- A team approach is utilised in each centre and the needs of each child and each family is reviewed and discussed on a regular basis.
- Workers come from diverse backgrounds in social care, social work, psychotherapy, counselling, psychology, systemic, cognitive, play therapy and other therapeutic approaches. All professionals are employed as Family Workers.





Measuring the impact of our work

 The data shows that on average children and families using our services benefit and the children and families who have the most difficulties in their lives make the biggest gains.
