CHILD & ADOLESCENT COUNSELLING SERVICES Who?

Kerry Adolescent Counselling Service (KACS) for children & young people 12-18 years in Kerry South West Counselling Centre (SWCC)

for children & young people 5-18+ years in Kerry **Cuan Counselling** for children & young people 12-25 years in West Kerry

What? Counselling services providing a safe space to explore issues and provide support with:

- Feelings and Emotions,
- Education and Expectations,
- Relationships and Sexuality,
- Moods,
- Bereavement and Loss Family or Peer, Family Separation or Divorce,
- Worries and Concerns,
- Substance Abuse,
- Eating Distress and Body Issues,
- Self Harm/ Suicidal Ideation following consultation with GP.

HSE COUNSELLING IN PRIMARY CARE

Who? Counselling In Primary Care (CIPC) is for adults (18+) with a Medical Card referred by their GP What? Counselling in Primary Care (CIPC) is a short-term counselling service that provides up to 8 counselling sessions with a professionally qualified and accredited Counsellor/Therapist.

JIGSAW KERRY

Who? Jigsaw Kerry is for young people aged 12-25 years and provides brief, solution focused intervention lasting up to 6 sessions. What? Jigsaw Kerry is a mental health support

service for 12-25 year olds living in, or with a connection to Tralee, West Kerry, North Kerry or Castleisland areas of Kerry*

Jigsaw works with young people who have mild to moderate mental health concerns for a period of up to 6 sessions.

*Please note that there are plans to expand Jigsaw across Co. Kerry in 2016/17.

HOW TO ACCESS SERVICE

Referral: A young person and/or their parent/ guardian can contact the services directly in person or by phone.

Agencies such as HSE, CAMHS, schools, NEPS, juvenile liaison officers (JLOs), youth services or GPs can also make a referral to the service.

Parental permission required - Yes where a child or young person is less than 18 years old.

KERRY ADOLESCENT COUNSELLING SERVICE

- Donations Accepted

SOUTHWEST COUNSELLING CENTRE -

Low Cost Counselling. Free counselling is available to those experiencing suicidal ideation/intention and anyone bereaved by suicide. Free crisis pregnancy counselling.

CUAN COUNSELLING - Donations Accepted

Referral: The service is free to adults with a full medical card and you access the service through your GP who can refer you.

Cost: Free to Medical Card Holders Referred by Their GP

Referral:

A young person can directly self refer.

A parent/guardian or concerned person can contact the service directly.

Health agencies and professionals/schools/youth organisations/sporting/voluntary bodies can directly refer.

Cost: Free

SERVICE

NATIONAL EDUCATIONAL PSYCHOLOGICAL SERVICE (NEPS)

Who? The service is for children and adolescents aged 5-18 years.

What? Types of referrals to the service: Developmental, learning, social, emotional and behavioural difficulties which impact a pupil's learning and socialisation in schools.

HSE PRIMARY CARE: CHILD, ADOLESCENT & FAMILY PSYCHOLOGY SERVICE

Who? The service is for children and adolescents (0-18 years) and their families. What? The service provides psychological assessment and intervention for children who present with moderate to severe social, emotional and behavioural difficulties which significantly impact on everyday functioning and impair the child and family's wellbeing.

CONSOLE SUICIDE BEREAVEMENT COUNSELLING SERVICE

Who? Console provides support services, information and counselling for children, young people, parents and families, bereaved by suicide. What? Suicide bereavement counselling and supports for children and adolescents, who have experienced the loss of a family member or friend, by suicide.

Parental & family support on how to talk to children about suicide.

Suicide prevention service, supports and resources.

PIETA HOUSE

Who? Pieta House is for children & young people under 18 and adults - all age groups. What? Pieta House provides free, therapeutic supports to people who have suicidal ideation, who have attempted suicide and those who engage in self-harm

HSE CHILD & ADOLESCENT MENTAL HEALTH SERVICE (CAMHS)

Who? For Children 0-18 years with mental health disorders.

What? CAMHS is a specialist tertiary mental health service for children with the most severe disabling mental health disorders such as ADHD, eating disorders, depressive disorders and psychotic disorders.

HSE ADULT MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

Who? For young people and adults aged 17+ years with mental health disorders.

What? A mental health care service for young people (17+) and adults with mental health disorders. Disorders include: eating disorders, depressive disorders and psychotic disorders.

HOW TO ACCESS SERVICE

FOR CHILDREN 5-18 YEARS: NEPS does not operate a referral system. Each school has an assigned NEPS psychologist and a dedicated allocation of service time. The school Principal may request the involvement of the psychologist in supporting teachers and parents in assessment of and developing interventions to meet a pupil's needs. Where the psychologist is involved directly with or on behalf of a pupil, parental permission is sought. (NEPS psychologist work at both individual and systemic levels in schools). **Cost: Free**

Referral: Any individual who is concerned about a child's emotional, behavioural, social and psychological well-being can make a referral to the service. Parental permission required - Yes

Cost: Free of Charge

FOR CHILDREN 6+ AND THOSE BEREAVED BY SUICIDE

Console services can be accessed by Self referral or family member referral. Referrals are also accepted from Agencies and G.P.s Individuals or concerned persons must complete a Referral Form which can be downloaded from the website, collected from the centre in person, or by calling the centre or helpline. Agencies referring a child or young person under 18 years old will have to obtain parental/ guardian consent

Cost: Donations Accepted

Referral: Referrals are accepted from young adults, parents and concerned adults. Referrals are also accepted from agencies such as CAMHS, HSE and School. Parental permission required - Yes where a child or

young person is less than 18 years old.

Cost: Free of Charge

Referral must be by a health professional. Parents or teachers cannot refer children directly to CAMHS. Referrals are accepted from the following professionals: GPs, area medical officers and pediatrician, NEPS, HSE senior health professionals including social workers, psychologists, speech & language therapists, occupational therapists and public health nurses. Parental permission required - Yes **Cost: Free of Charge**

Referral: Any individual who notes concern in relation to a young person (17+) or adult in crisis can make a referral to the service. If possible, referral to the service is made via a GP / South Doc out of hours or the A&E Department of Kerry General Hospital.

Cost: Free of Charge
