SUMMARY OF LAOIS AND OFFALY YOUTH PARTICIPATION CONSULTATION 2019

Listening to the views and opinions of children and young people in their space. Hearing their collective voice. Highlighting the concerns and gaps where they believe appropriate action is needed to support them.



What is CYPSC?

Children and Young People's Services Committees (CYPSC) are a key structure identified by Government to plan and co-ordinate services for children and young people in every county in Ireland.

Who is it for?

Children and Young People's Services Committees are responsible for securing better outcomes for children and young people in their area through more effective integration of existing services and interventions.

Their age remit spans all children and young people aged from 0 to 24 years.

Who is the CYPSC?

The CYPSC is a committee of adults who work in services and agencies in Laois and Offaly who support children and young people through various health, education, justice, community, youth and other services.

What does it do?

The purpose of the CYPSC is to ensure better working together, sharing of ideas and funding, to achieve the best outcomes for all children and young people in their area.

The LaoisOffaly CYPSC works collectively to plan and co-ordinate services for children and young people and promote the best interests of children and young people in Laois and Offaly.

The committee works towards the five National Outcomes for children and young people, as set out in Better Outcomes, Brighter Futures; the National Policy Framework for Children and Young People 2014 – 2020.

What are the 5 National Outcomes?



to create opportunities for children and young people to be involved in influencing, designing and contributing to the development of policies, supports and services, and programmes within Counties Laois and Offaly.

How we consulted with Children & Young People?

The Laois Offaly CYPSC established a Children and Youth Participation Subgroup to facilitate the active participation of young people in the development of the Children and Young People's three year plan for the area.


The Children and Youth Participation subgroup developed a Child and Youth Participation Consultation for Laois and Offaly, based on the "Lundy Model" of participation.

The aim was to facilitate participatory workshops to ensure the voices of young people were heard in both Counties and work to ensure decision makers engage with, listen to and incorporate the views of young people.

Workshops were designed by young people and adapted to suit the needs of all children and young people to maximise participation by creating a youth friendly safe space where they could voice their opinions and express themselves. Children and Young people were asked to discuss and highlight their concerns and issues across the 5 outcome areas.

Children and Young people were asked to express what's good and not so good about living in Co. Laois and Co. Offaly.

"Lundy Model" of participation



This model provides a way of conceptualising Article 12 of the UNCRC which is intended to focus educational decision-makers on the distinct, albeit interrelated, elements of the provision. The four elements have a rational chronological order:

- SPACE: Children must be given safe, inclusive opportunities to form and express their view
- VOICE: Children must be facilitated to express their view
- AUDIENCE: The view must be listened to.
- INFLUENCE: The view must be acted upon, as appropriate.

PRIORITY AREAS

What are the priority areas from the consultations with children and young people?

Across both counties children young people identified similar gaps in services and supports relating to each outcome.

Outcome 1.

Active & healthy, physical & mental wellbeing

- Mental Health Services/Counselling Services is needed, more information on mental health wellbeing and sexual health information including LGBTI+ (outside of School)
- 2. More Youth Services/Groups/Clubs, affordable Summer camps
- 3. Sports- More Sports Clubs needed, Teen Gym/sports pitches
- 4. Safe Parks & Safe Spaces for young people and those with additional needs
- 5. Activities access to a wider range of activities and activity infrastructure e.g. cycle lanes

"I have a younger brother with additional needs. We can't go to a park as a family because there is nothing there for him to use" Young person age 13 "Not every parent can afford the cost of some of the summer camps. It's too expensive, especially when you've other brothers and sisters" Young person age 14

"We have no mental health services that are easy to get into...by the time you are seen you've already had to deal with it on your own" Young person aged 16

Outcome 2.

- 1. Life skills training, study skills and afterschool programmes
- 2. Mental Health & Sex Education Mental Health services in school and Sex Ed including LGBTI+ Sex Ed. (outside of school)
- 3. Inclusive learning more services for people with additional needs, different learning styles, and better school facilities
- 4. Post Leaving Certificate options- access to information on options, costs and stigma around Youthreach, PLC's, Apprenticeships
- 5. Youth clubs More Youth Services/Groups/Clubs supports
- 6. Homeless & housing More housing for homeless

"What am I going to do when I go to college? I need to learn how to cook and turn on a washing machine or even open a bank account... we're not taught this stuff" Young person aged 15

"We need more sex education..especially around LGBTI+ sexual health... I don't want to go learn sexual health with a teacher and then have to see them after in maths or English class" Young person age 17

Achieving full potential in all areas of learning & development

"Not everyone wants to go to college. In school you're only told about access to college. You're never told about other options like PLC or apprenticeships" Young person aged 16

Outcome 3.

- Gardaí and Crime need to reduce crime regarding drug use and knife crime, need more Gardaí and faster Gardaí response time. Better relationships with Gardaí are needed.
- 2. Info on services to support & protect oneself- there is a wide range of info requests highlighted from bullying, abuse, neglect, online safety, knowledge of the consequences of crime. To have this information in an accessible space with key people to talk to who can help inform and support them.
- 3. Safe places for young people
- 4. CCTV & Community Alert
- 5. Infrastructure- better footpaths, roads and lighting especially in rural areas

"There needs to be more CCTV, especially around Portlaoise town. It would make the place safer and there would be less crime" Young person aged 16

Safe & protected from harm

"We don't know the guards... like I never see them except when there is something wrong" Young person aged 15

Outcome 4.

"There needs to be more groups and services..especially in certain areas there is nothing for young people to do after school or during summer" Young person aged 13 "We need more work experience..it's hard to get a job without experience" Young person aged 18

Economic security & opportunity

- 1. Further Education options more opportunities for further ed., training and apprenticeship courses. Youth focused material and accessible material and service.
- 2. More Job & work experience opportunities
- 3. Life skills training
- 4. More Youth Services/groups/ clubs
- 5. Student Grants information about supports

Outcome 5.

- 1. Environment Opportunity to engage in social and environmental situations, green environment, less litter, improve Tidy Towns
- 2. Opinions & input Information on youth rights, responsibilities, services and supports and more opportunities to give opinions
- 3. Education System having the opportunity to express yourself in the education system
- 4. Better Broadband
- 5. Access to youth services and better transportation

"We need to start looking after our towns and we need to go green. Every young person should start helping the environment more" Young person age 15 "Why aren't we allowed to express ourselves more?... even during local elections nobody comes and asks us what we need...why isn't there more youth committees?" Young person

Connected, respected & contributing to their world

OVERALL ISSUES FROM CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE HIGHLIGHTED ACROSS THE 5 OUTCOME AREAS

- 1. Mental health, LGBTI+, Sexual Health information and supports & information to protect oneself from various harm factors
- 2. The need for more Youth Services, Clubs, Groups, child and youth activities and affordable camps
- 3. Safe & inclusive spaces for youth; safe parks, accessibility and inclusive spaces for those with additional needs
- 4. Life skills
- 5. Post leaving cert options, job & work opportunities, input to the education system, stigma regarding certain options
