

State of the Nation's Children Online Report: The State of the Nation's Children (SONC) report provides a comprehensive picture of our children's lives. It presents key information on children's health, behavioural and educational outcomes, and their relationships with their parents and their friends.

SONC provides the most up-to-date data on the National Set of Child Wellbeing indicators, and charts the wellbeing of children in Ireland. tracks changes over time and benchmarks progress in Ireland relative to other countries. National Childminding Action Plan 2021 – 2028: The <u>National Childminding</u> <u>Action Plan 2021 – 2028</u> was launched in April of last year. This Action Plan is a pathway to be developed over the next 8 years that sets out steps towards regulation, support and subsidies, for all paid, non-relative childminders. The Action Plan will involve change and significant benefits for childminders, children and the families using their services. 



This FREE online course is suitable for victims/survivors of domestic violence and abuse, along with front line staff who engage with victims/survivors. The aim is to help them to make sense of and understand what has happened to them, instead of the whole experience just feeling like a horrible mess. The Freedom Programme also describes in detail how children are affected by being exposed to this kind of abuse and very importantly how their lives are improved when the abuse is removed.
