#### **Roscommon Youth Service**

Although we have had to close our physical doors, we are definitely still here and working hard to support young people across County Roscommon through a range of services being offered online, by phone or text and more. Groups are being offered online through Zoom and other video platforms, Youth Cafes, Darts Groups, Music lessons, Boredom Buster Groups, Walk and Talk groups and Quizzes. One to one supports are available for young people aged 10 - 24 years via call, video calling or text and online life coaching for 17 - 24 year olds. Activity packs for 10 - 12 year olds have been developed which contain competitions and challenges.

# Jigsaw

Jigsaw continues to provide support to young people, parents and professionals during the Covid-19 period. While our face-to-face services are suspended, Jigsaw Clinicians are providing phone support to young people who had been attending the service.
