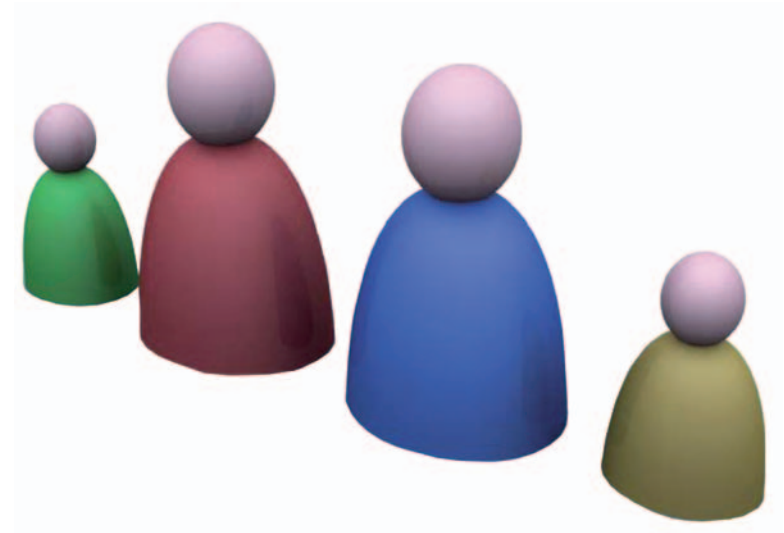

The Alzheimer Society of Ireland is the leading dementia specific service provider in Ireland offering home care services.

Services

Day Care Services - Le Cairde Day Care Services, The Grounds of Our Lady's Hospital, Cashel, Co Tipperary 062/63060. We offer a service five days a week. The service is open between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. Where possible we provide transport. The service aims to provide activities that are stimulating and of personal interest. During the day a programme of activities that includes reminiscence, reality, music, drama and relaxation therapies is available. Gentle exercise is also encouraged. Every effort is made to ensure that a friendly, homely atmosphere exists. A full meal is provided during the day. On some days there is a hairdresser and also a chiropodist & other services in the centre. Most of the costs of this service are provided by local fundraising, by an annual grant from the HSE & by a modest daily charge of €15 paid by or on behalf of those who attend the service.

This service assigns a trained dementia care worker to a client's residence for a designated number of hours per week. The service offers support, stimulation and activity for the person with dementia as well as support and respite for the carer.

Alzheimer Café - The Community Resource Centre, Kickham Street, Clonmel – The last Thursday of each month from 11am – 1.00pm - *The Alzheimer café is a place where people with dementia, their carers and family members can come to meet and socialise, get information and support from staff and volunteers. Parent to Parent Programme:	Preventative drug education programme focusing on parents and understanding drug culture aimed at parents of children from 10 to 12 years. Programme involves six two hour sessions and topics covered include: Putting yourself in the way - four things parents need to know to protect their children from today's toxic culture, Signs and symptoms, Trust as a tool to develop character, The importance of a positive belief system, Managing the internet in your home, The seven common traps.
Basic Drug Awareness:	Basic drug awareness - Signs and Symptoms, Services Available aimed at parents of those transferring to second level education involving two, two hour sessions. Department of Social Protection

The Department of Social Protection administers a range of income maintenance payments, alongside the primary Social Welfare payments. The Community Service provides a personal consultation, advice and advocacy service with service users regarding income issues, primary payment of Supplementary Welfare Allowance (SWA), which is a statutory short term means tested income support. Eligibility for SWA is determined by being habitually resident in Ireland, satisfying a means test and not being in full time employment, education or on strike. Additional supplementary payments, according to service user's needs and eligibility include Rent Supplement (once the local authority deem person in need of housing), Mortgage Interest Supplement, Diet, Travel and Additional Heating Supplements, and once off Exceptional Needs Payments or Urgent Needs Payments.

The service also conducts means assessment of service users for eligibility for such welfare allowances as Blind Welfare Allowance, Nursing Home Support Scheme, Mobility Allowance, the Back to School Allowance and for Medical Cards. The service is administered locally by individual Community Welfare Officers at 33 locations around the county, usually in the local Health Centre. More detailed information can be found at www.welfare.ie

HSE Community Development Service

The HSE Community Development Service operates from a concept of health which recognises the wider social determinants of health in the community and the close association between inequalities of health status and social exclusion. Adopting a generic community development approach and in partnership with other like – minded agencies from the statutory and the community and voluntary sectors, the service participates in initiatives around the county to support disadvantaged groups which are in one way or another excluded from equitable access to resources and services to identify their specific needs and to strengthen their capacity to meet these needs. 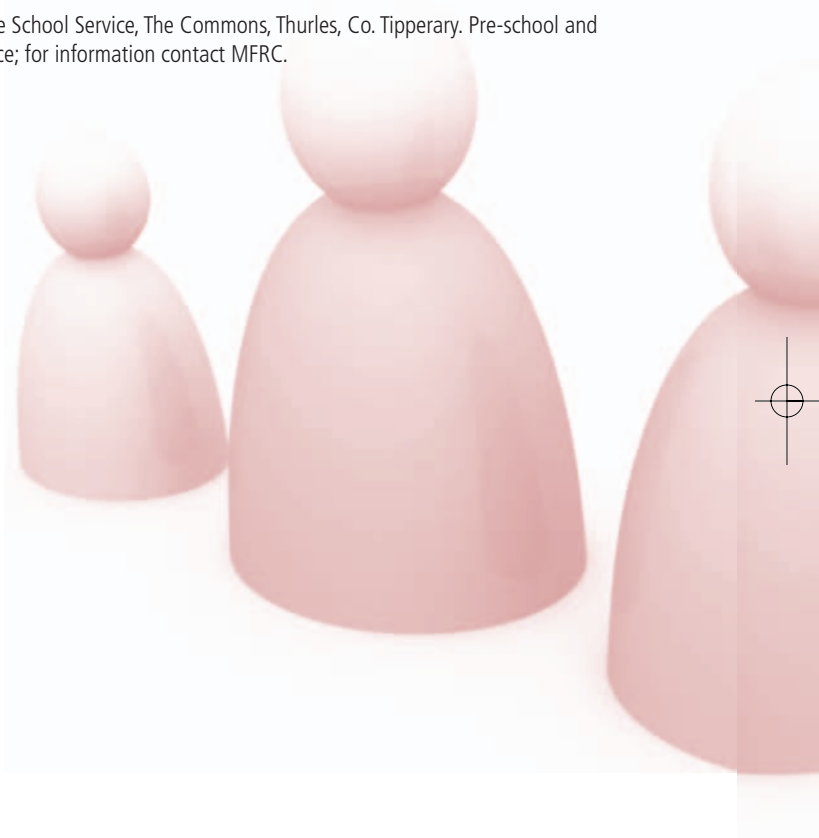

South Tipperary Drug Outreach Project

The South Tipperary Drug Outreach Project is a confidential service and is run by the Waterford and South Tipperary Community Youth Service. It provides services and responses for persons aged 13 years and upwards who are involved in high risk substance misuses and are experiencing social exclusion as a result of their substance misuse and socio economic background. The project aims to reduce the harm that people can do to themselves as a result of their substance misuse and supports and encourages them to begin to address the issues / problems presenting in their lives as a result of this substance misuse. The project is particularly focused on linking the individual seeking help into relevant support services in the locality.

Services

One to One: The outreach service offers one to one work with individuals aged 13 years upwards who are engaging in high risk substance misuse. The project also engages with those in recovery from substance misuse, and to a lesser extent, concerned persons affected by substance misuse issues. This work is particularly aimed at enhancing motivation and supporting clients in decisions made, with regard to addressing their addiction issues.

Brief The project aims to engage people for a maximum of 12 sessions. However, clients

Intervention: are welcome and encouraged to return to the project, if they require additional assistance. Alternative support services are put in place for service clients where need is determined.

Education and Awareness: The project works from a harm reduction ethos. This aim to assist individuals engaged with the project to review their substance usage and, where they are currently unable or disinterested in achieving total abstinence, harm reduction works towards encouraging safer drug / alcohol use through education and awareness.

Auricular Acupuncture: The outreach worker offers auricular acupuncture with specifically attempts to address issues pertinent to addiction, such as alleviating anxiety, assistance with sleep patterns, and reduction with craving.

Service Integration: This service works very closely with the HSE Substance Misuse Service and with the Coolgreany House addiction team. The project aims to link suitable persons to such services and also to best inform clients of their options with regard to accessing assistance with their issues. All such decisions are made with the clients consent.

Service Users: The target group for the fore-mentioned services generically refers to any individual either directly or indirectly affected by substance misuse.

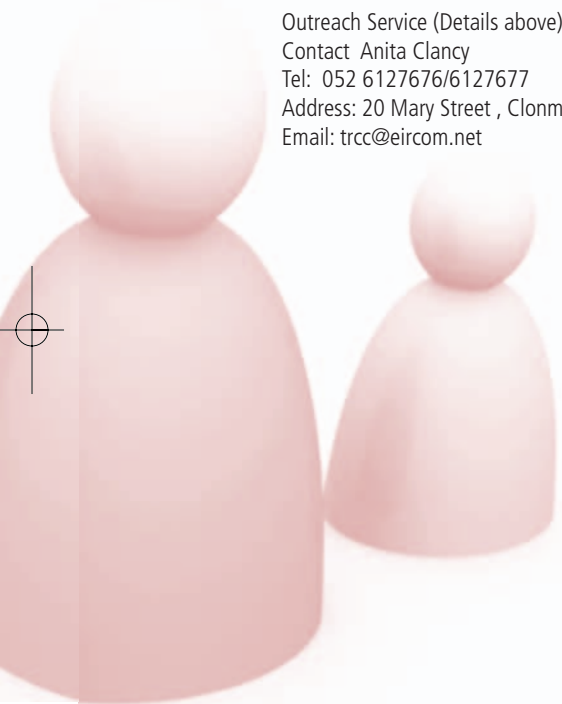

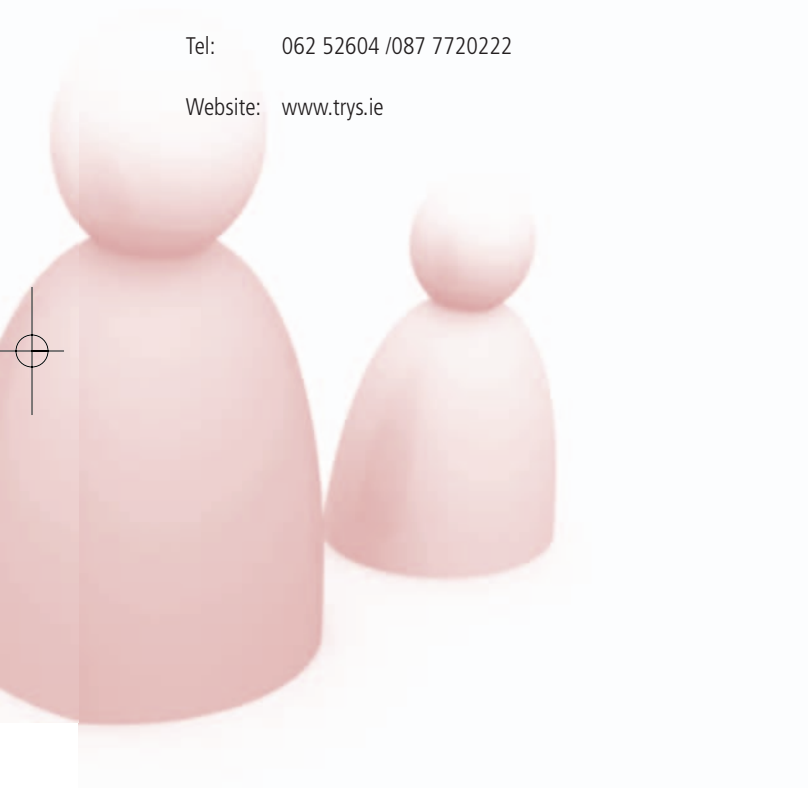
